- Each and every 7th grader gets a PAL mentor
- We can help them with:

- By empowering youth to "know the signs" and uniting all people who value the protection of children

- Fully virtual Spring 2020 & Spring 2021, transitioning to in person for Spring 2022

- This will help bridge the gap between Grady and Hamilton, to hopefully begin the 6th graders transition to Hamilton next school year!








6th Grade Orientation

- 6th grade students came up to Hamilton for tours lead by PALs along with Field Day activities held at Hamilton for all 6th Grade students




Grade Level Videos
